"We don't like what we don't understand... in fact, it scares us" – my favourite lyric in 'Beauty and the Beast'. Never truer words spoken. Last night we finished setting our final big company number, 'The Mob Song'. Throughout this entire process I have been amazed by our brilliant company and their ability to retain information and deliver energetic and committed performances. It has been a special year for me in many respects – it has been a celebration of ten year's hard work, a time to celebrate the people who made it all possible and a time to reflect and be grateful for everything we've achieved. 'Beauty and the Beast' seemed the ideal choice to present as our

10th anniversary show - a beautiful story with a stunning score, perfect roles for all the people I love working with and a show with big Broadway pizzazz and heart to match. It hasn't been the easiest journey - juggling many different hats, setting epic company numbers that run for nearly ten minutes and managing a cast of nearly 30 people – there were times when I thought we would never get here! But here we are and I am thrilled with the results. All of my heart and imagination has been poured into this magical show and although the thought of presenting this Disney classic at times was intimidating. I have refused to compromise on telling my own version of this story. 'Beauty and the Beast' is ultimately a classic love story about not judging a book by its cover and learning to love the inner beauty within others. For me, it's much more than that. It's a lesson in acknowledging our own flaws, learning to reevaluate the things we don't "understand" and discovering the truth and beauty within ourselves. That is exactly how I would sum up the last 10 years. I dedicate this show to all the family I've made along the way and all the people who have ever bought a ticket to watch us - it's been one hell of a ride!

Rose Bale as Belle

Rose works as a Secondary School English teacher and her Dad dresses as a woman at Christmas (if you know, you know). Playing Belle fulfils a lifetime dream for Rose and it is no surprise that 'Beauty and the Beast' is her all time favourite Disney film – "it is a beautiful 'tale as old as time', full of magic enchantment and forgiveness. I love the message that beauty can be found within and that everyone deserves a second chance". If Rose was turned into an enchanted object for the day, she would be a broken clock – "so at least I'm on time twice a day!".

IN THE EYE OF THE BEHOLDER A romantic poet once wrote "Beauty is truth, truth beauty". But what do these ideas really mean? The dictionary defines:

BEAUTY: the quality that gives pleasure to the sight... a particular grace or excellence **TRUTH:** faithfulness; constancy...

We can appreciate the romantic idea of natural scenes as essentially beautiful: a sunset, a mountain, a waterfall, but when it comes to applying this idea of beauty in our fellow human beings, things become a whole lot more complicated! We have all heard sayings like "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder" and "You can't judge a book by its cover", but real-life does not always take account of this proverbial wisdom.

We all respond to certain features in other people but, culturally, we have created new and different ideals of 'beauty', which are almost totally based on outside appearances – glossy magazines are always telling is how we can reach these artificially created standards of beauty and we are bombarded with the same sort of thing from our television screen and in the flawless faces and figures of film stars and models.

As human beings, we also tend to instinctively shrink from anything that is very different from what we think is 'normal.' The kind of horror we feel is well exploited in stories that have been turned into popular entertainment such as The Hunchback of Notre Dame or The Phantom of the Opera. Something which is simply a difference rather than a disability is all too often considered ugly and should be feared and persecuted.

Fairy tales are often a way of passing on the wisdom of previous generations in the form of a story. Although the moral of the tale may stay the same, ways of telling the story have to keep up with the times to make sure people take note and listen to them.

The story of 'Beauty and the Beast' was first written in 1740, although the story itself is certainly far older than that. Two hundred and fifty years later, Disney's version of the story gives us a heroine who starts out fairly sure of herself, but who is definitely seen as 'different'. The townspeople admit that she is beautiful, but think she is strange because she is more interested in books than boys! Belle has to be tested by a series of experiences before she comes to realise who she really is, beneath her beauty outside. The Beast has already been turned inside out; his human outside has been replaced by a beastly appearance which more accurately reflects his character and behaviour. Both of them have to learn important lessons about the true nature of beauty before they can find happiness both within themselves and then, finally, with each other.

The story of Beauty and the Beast is a fascinating and entertaining way of showing us that it might be a good idea to try and see past surface appearances, whether they be beautiful or beastly, if we want to find the true beauty that lies within.
